
The 5 'C's of our Creativity Coalition

Our challenge, therefore, is to attract people's curiosity.




- Strategic Funding Partners

- Collaborative Delivery Partners


Two of the groups focus on our strategic progress and the other two work on our development and delivery.

Children's Hubs offer art, sculpture, music, storytelling, social drama, filmmaking and photography. All these are used to stimulate creativity and imagination. Many young people, particularly those on the margins, do not have an opportunity to access these kind of learning experiences in formal school settings.



Paper Boat has developed an innovative approach for use within the hubs that is largely based on MIT's 'Learning Creative Learning' programme

This approach helps children to look for and discover solutions to problems – it follows a spiral of imagine, create, play, share, and reflect – a continuous loop that frames innovative and entrepreneurial approaches to learning.

They can explore creative gateways that stimulate and inspire. They can build their confidence, resilience begin to see the infinite potential in their own lives.
